Introduction of PKU-UT Winter Institute 2016:

Peking University (PKU) and the University of Tokyo (UT) will launch a jointly administrated Winter Institute on Critical Theory for graduate students. Two professors and three graduate students from each university will contribute to it. This is a program under the strategic partnership between PKU and UT. UT is a host university for PKU-UT Winter Institute 2016 and PKU is that for PKU-UT Summer/ Winter Institute 2016 or 2017.

Research Agenda:

The First PKU-UT Winter Institute has as its goal the rethinking of prevailing, i.e., U.S.-centered, models of Area Studies through critical reflections on literary, historiographical, philosophical and politico-philosophical traditions of East Asia and Europe. By revisiting some of the foundational texts and core issues concerning the Self and the Other; civilization versus barbarism; center and periphery; enemy and friend; inclusion and exclusion; and peaceful, respectful, and value-plural coexistence of strongly-held identities, the institute seeks to place current paradigms and discourses of area studies under critical scrutiny in search of new possibilities more compatible with a simultaneously globalized and localized world. The work of the institute is to be multidisciplinary and critical in nature, based on seminar-style discussions led by faculty advisors. A reading packet will be supplied ahead of time so participants will have finished the assigned readings in advance.
