Toshiki OKADA won as playwright the 49th Kishida Kunio Drama Award with *Five Days in March* in 2005, and as novelist the 2nd Kenzaburo Oe Award with *The End of the Special Time Allowed to Us* in 2007. The most recent dramatic work, *Zero Cost House*,* in which he deals with his own life, is an international collaboration with the Philadelphia-based “Pig Iron Theatre Company.” In it he tries to propose an alternative way of life in the post-Fukushima Era, getting some motifs from *Walden; Or, Life in the Woods* by Henry David Thoreau and the artistic activities of Kyohei Sakaguchi, “an architect who produces no architecture.”
